In these uncertain times, may each of us be receptive to the future and all that it holds.

This old footpath has seen many a child hurry from Luton, to the village school in Ideford. The sound of laughter and secrets echoing down through the dappled shade.

From Rixafer Rd, through a kissing gate walkers can enjoy an open, grassy path over fields, hedged with honeysuckle, sweet brier, hawthorn and buddleia. This first part of the path is still a delight. Reach the second kissing gate and walkers, could until recently, slowly wander downwards through a dark tunnel of trees and richly covered banks. Banks abundant with flora and fauna, haunts of wood mice, wild rabbits and shining beetles. Ground nesting bees found safety in crevices and tree roots. In Spring and early Summer, bluebells, wood violets, celandines and primroses formed a tapestry of colour and scents. The sounds of nesting birds filled the air. Nuthatches, treecreepers and busy wrens searching for grubs and insects. Yes, this top stretch was narrow and in places uneven, but with interest at every step until the path widened naturally, ending near the Barns at Lower Colleybrook. Who would want to hurry?

The sun dappled tunnel has changed drastically, established bankside trees have been cut down, the lovely banks themselves have been scraped clean of their flora, a wide gash at the top of the path has forced another wide gateway through, exposing tree roots. The lane itself has been widened and the surface 'levelled'. Is there really a need for more access for powerful polluting vehicles? What has this lovely footpath done to justify such desecration? Our drovers' lanes, green lanes and public footpaths link us with nature in all its diversity, surely they should be protected for generations to come?
