

As I write this, we've just celebrated the 80th Anniversary of VE Day. That was a day to remember not just the end of WW2 in Europe, but also the many who lost their lives or were injured during that conflict. In one of the TV interviews I watched, the individual concerned commented that it was important to have this time of remembrance, so that we would decide not to let such a conflict happen again.

Just as remembrance is important in civil society, it is also a key theme in the Christian faith. Only a few weeks ago we celebrated Good Friday and Easter, days when we remembered what Jesus did for us. On Good Friday, we remembered how He suffered a cruel death by crucifixion on a Roman cross. On Easter Sunday we remembered how Jesus rose again, defeating death and bringing us a message of hope.

The Christian message is that Jesus, the Anointed One, the Son of God, died in our place taking upon himself the punishment that each one of us deserves for our failure to live in accordance with God's standards. I suspect that each one of us knows in our heart of hearts the selfishness that resides within us and that we've not lived as we would have liked, let alone as God requires.

Yet the glorious truth of Easter is that just as Jesus defeated death and rose to new life, so he makes that new life available to us, if we put our trust in Him. This is the Christian hope. Hence the importance of remembering all that He achieved, something that Christians do every time we take communion. That is something Jesus Himself asked us to do, see Luke 22v19 for example.

Therefore, as we live each day in the light of all that was achieved by those who've gone before and especially the Lord Jesus Christ, let's be those who are continually thankful.

12.03 Policy reviews and updates: Standing orders, was approved at the last meeting. Equality, Data Protection/FOI were reviewed and approved at the meeting.

12.04 Updates from previous meetings: Cllr. Bellamy, asked about the need for "all kept birds to be housed and undercover". CURRENTLY All birds (chickens etc) must be protected from Wild Birds and that includes not sharing water and/or food, housing or netting must be used". All owners should be registered with the APHA. The current situation is that avian flu has now passed to other animals, a cat and some sheep. Wild birds do have avian flu. Avian Flu is now a risk to humans. An article will also be put into the parish news, posters are needed.

13/04/25 PLANNING APPLICATION:

13.01 Planning Applications: 25/00495/HOU - Corner Cottage, IDEFORD.
Proposal - Timber roof structure. There are no objections to this application.
13.02 Planning Decision: Certificate of Lawfulness for Apple Cottage, a discussion about permitted development was held.

14/04/25 CONCERNS RAISED BY PARISHIONERS TO COUNCILLORS - Cllr. Batting, the Ideford Vintage Fare will not run this year, due to a lack of volunteers. Mention was made of everyone in the village being stretched as there are fewer numbers covering more events. A possible solution was to run it every other year.

Another concern was a swing on the green this was mentioned on social media. There was no request to put a swing up, therefore it was a liability/ insurance issue. Comments were received that the parish council doesn't do enough for the community. The council suggests that parishioners should attend any of our meetings to discuss any matter in person. The chair indicated there is nowhere to put anything, as the parish council doesn't own any ground. The Millennium Green has to be an open space, this was part of the strict conditions originally placed on the Millennium Greens at the outset. Broadland's was then discussed - Cllr Peart has not had a response from TDC at present.

15/04/25 CLERK'S REPORT AND FINANCE: The balance of accounts £13751.12 and bank reconciliation for March was provided and approved by the council. A request for payments was made for the Village Hall Invoices, Clerks Invoice and DALC. Decisions and enforcement to be placed on every agenda. An administrative update was provided on recent correspondence and the clerk is seeing the internal auditor the day after the meeting. A .gov domain was discussed and has subsequently been confirmed by Japg (auditing) that the clerk as a minimum has to be on a .gov email. Discussion was held as to whether the hosting should be html or word press, the advantages and dis-advantages of this was explained, the council felt that word press subject to confirmation by Cllr Gardner would be appropriate.

Sustainable Ideford - Z is for Zero Waste

I can't believe we have got to Z in our A-Z of sustainability. Z is for Zero Waste. The term is all about preventing waste from ending up in landfills, incinerators or the environment. The 3 R's again - Reducing, reusing and recycling in order to minimise environmental impact.

Here are a few suggestions of ways to reduce waste:

- Reduce single use plastic. Avoid plastic bags and water bottles. Opt for reusable alternatives such as a cloth bag and reusable water bottles. If caught thirsty, use that plastic water bottle several times before disposing of it. Consider buying toilet paper and kitchen towel wrapped in paper try 'Who Gives a Crap'. Use laundry sheets and dishwasher capsules that come in a cardboard box. Try The Green Co., Regn or Smol. Subscribe to cleaning product companies providing a reusable container which you can fill with water and a capsule.
- 2. Shop B Corp. In the UK more businesses are obtaining this accreditation, demonstrating their dedication to ethical and sustainable business practices, prioritising people and the planet. Check out Abel & Cole; The Modern Milkman; Beer 52 and Riverford amongst many others.
- 3. Compost: Turn vegetable peelings, fruit skins etc and other organic matter into valuable compost for your garden and houseplants. The Council will sell you a compost bin which is discounted through a company called Get Composting.
- 4. Bulk Goods. Buy staples in bulk and store them in reusable containers and jars. Consider joining a local food buying club or shop from a refill shop such as The Refill and Deli and Happy Bean Health both in Teignmouth. Also Cressicks in Newton Abbot.
- 5. Avoid produce, especially fruit and vegetables, that are wrapped in plastic.
- 6. Ditch Tea bags. A lot of tea bags are loaded with micro plastics that are bad for you and the environment. Buy tea loose and invest in a mug strainer or try Fairtrade, Clipper or B Corp tea.
- 7. Green up your wardrobe. Buy only sustainable clothing brands. Shop at Charity shops or buy and sell through companies such as Vinted Ltd.
- 8. Plan your meals a week in advance. This can streamline trips to the shops and reduce cost and waste. You may even end up with more spare time.
- Switch to digital documents (eg bank statements, insurance policies) to save on paper and ink. Get yourself off junk mail lists. Don't order expensive colourful brochures.
