If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.' (Matthew 16:24)

Happy Lent, everyone! A time of denial and crosses! Now, you might understandably read those words and feel discouraged, for we do not instinctively find pleasure in denial and the cross. Yet this is simply the other side of the coin to the Great Commandments:



'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart

and with all your soul and with all your mind...You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' (Matthew 22:37-39)

None of us is born already able to play the piano, or speak multiple languages, or run a marathon, but we require training to accomplish these wonderful things, so no of us is born already expert in the ways of love. Jesus Himself is the Way in which we become experts in love. *Whoever abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing '.* (John 15:5). So, if we want to be people who can truly love God and each other, then we must deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Jesus. Easy, no?

If we're honest we find it difficult. Love is super inconvenient; it asks things of me which I'm not necessarily inclined to give, and to let go of things I don't want to let go of. But that's why Lent is such a wonderful gift! Here is a relatively short-term goal of just over six weeks we can set ourselves to become better at loving. And we have been given also the equipment we need: Prayer, Fasting, & Almsgiving! Deepening our relationship with God in prayer, means drawing more love from the fountain of Love Itself. By fasting (not dieting!), we worship God by offering up something we desire, saying, 'I love you more than this thing.' By almsgiving, we express our love for God by serving our Lord Jesus in those around us, and we open our hearts to reciprocate His love by revealing it to others.

Now, we may not be perfect by Easter, but we will definitely be closer to God and to each other, and we will have tasted the deeper joy of what it means to love, what it means to be alive, what it means to be human! And all because we denied ourselves, took up our cross and followed Jesus. So, have a Happy Lent!

140/25 cont.	 Is there a conflict of interest between the Parish Council and the Millennium green? Cllr T Hill, indicated this is only the insurance policy and not affecting liability. The Parish Council is paying the insurance policy but not taking on liability as the Millenium Green has trustees as part of it's deeds. Who would pay the lawyers? Various councillors indicated that it is the insurance. Who would submit a claim? The Parish Council. Who has scrutinised the policy, Cllr C. Hill indicated he has read it. Cllr T. Hill indicated If anyone is worried about what's happening on the Green, please become a trustee. The trustees are written within the deed and as this is all for the sake of the community to make sure that the Millen- nium Green remains as an asset to the village. Cllr C. Hill explained the basics of insurance provision and responsibilities. The positives from this is the MG will come to the Parish Council on a quar- terly basis to keep us informed. This means more people will be involved in keeping the MG as an asset to the village. No individual trustee would ever be held liable, however they have trustee liability insurance. The result of this discussion shows there is Improved governance and a saving to the community of £580. Public liability insurance is a pre-requisite to an asset of this nature. If anyone has any concerns, please come to our next meeting to discuss this. The Pound is an area that's has seen an incident but this was appropriately covered.

Strating on Monday March 10th

140/25 Gritting on the roads was raised. Will Vought had worked on it through Luton to Ideford. The council suggested a possible contact with Bishopsteignton Council to discuss snow and gritting for the future. Ideford Parish Council would be prepared to contribute to the costs

140.2 Sustainable Ideford. No report

140.3 Wildlife Wardens report: No report

140.4 Budget/ Precept a discussion was held and there was mention of a potential short fall, as we would be reducing the reserves. Band D properties are the benchmark that is used in precept calculations. A discussion was held on the amounts required. The Council approved a precept figure of £9725

140.5 Insurance - Cllr T. Hill provided a background to what has already been covered, in essence joining the Parish Council and MG would save money. The MG is run for the benefit of the village, it has no income so it fund raises to cover all it's costs and obviously the largest cost was the insurance.

The insurance policy, doesn't change the legal responsibility, the trustees still exist and the trustees would still be liable for what happens on the green. The Parish Council will still want to know what is happening and this will be shared regularly as Cllr T. Hill is a trustee. It was pointed out that if all the trustees left, the council would have to assume full responsibility.

Questions that arose previously:- Cllr T. Hill spoke to the insurance broker. 1. Specific queries including not mentioning the green specifically in the policy - that is standard practice.

2. The builders carrying out the work have their own insurance, the insurer can provide a Works in Progress insurance, however its the same cover as the builders, therefore no need for duplicate policies.

3. Question about safety measures. There is Harris fencing around the site and signs around the green. Risk assessments have been carried out.

4. Are we expecting the Millennium Green to contribute anything towards the insurance? Using this joint insurance has saved the council some £600 pounds. The Millennium Green, is in trust for the village.

5. Will the costs of the insurance rise upon completion? There will be a minimal impact, as the building is a single skin building of £30k.

6. Would anyone from the insurers come out? No need for them to, it's a standard policy.

What sort of dialogue or collaboration will be necessary between Green and ourselves needs to be discussed at another meeting. Be it maintenance or how the building is progressing and time scales etc. Without grants, the builders and others are volunteering their time for nothing. Cllr Carter-Woodwark wanted to know if there were any other grants, Cllr T. Hill

explained that they went through 12+ and the competition for grants is huge.

The parishioner questions:-

1. Who is responsible should litigation arise the trustees? Cllr T Hill explained regardless of this new insurance policy, the trustees remain liable for the Green, this is only the insurance policy.

139/25	REPORTS: There were no reports from District or County Councillors and PCSO Bunce reported for the period, 1 st to the 31 st December, one recorded offence to the police in the Ideford area.		
140/25	 PARISH MATTERS: 140.1 Updates A pothole was repaired within a week of it being reported near Butts Lane. The far end of the lane is rapidly deteriorating, but we are waiting on a response from the council as it's turning to gravel. New legislation about pot holes, the government will be giving 500 million to councils for pot hole work. The street lights are on again some during the morning and/or during the day. Cllr Gardner will follow this up. A parishioner has raised concerns about a the byway, Halden Lane, Hambolcombe Lane and then the lane going further up Tower Hill which goes up to the Common, all of which are in a poor state. Cllr T. Hill has emailed the rights of way (generic email), which has a 28 days response time, however their system indicates this is not a public right of way, so Cllr Hill has report them as roads, in highways. Hedges have been a problem on Haldon Lane due to the size of tractors and the state of the lane.

Sustainable Ideford: V is for vegetable growing

Throughout my married life I have been trying to grow vegetables of some sort in a variety of locations with varied success. There are an increasing number of people giving veg growing a try for a host of different reasons. These might include:-

- Financial benefits
- Becoming part of a community with a shared interest



- Mental wellbeing
- Ready availability of fresher (healthier) produce (vitamin content decreases during storage)
- Environmental benefits such a zero (plastic) packaging, less food waste, fewer 'food miles' and having the choice to minimise use of chemical pesticides

No one is suggesting veg growing is easy but with an enthusiasm and

willingness to experiment, things sometimes turn out better than expected and it is fun having a go.

Veg growers in the village have shared some of their useful experiences below for the benefit of others who may be finding the challenges outweighing the drive to get started.

Start easyJ.G.Use a container for saladleaves or herbs or redkale in a veg bed.	ThinningS.H.Especially root crops likecarrots and parsnips.	Long cropping period F.C. Leeks, kale, spinach beet and parsnips go on all winter.
Choose veg slugs avoid L.L. Salad bowl lettuce and leeks work for me.	LightP.W.Lettuces are one of thefew veg that can toleratesome shade	Protect I.W. From pigeons and rabbits using netting.
Protect from Frost F.B. Don't plant out courgettes too early. Make cloches with plastic bottles with the bottom cut off.	Use tubs for strawberries C.A. On staging. MILLENNIUM GREEN NEWS

Update on building and hedge planting

A huge thank you to everyone involved so far. We now have foundations and walls. This has only been achieved by people kindly donating their time, and an awful lot of resources, saving the village 1000's of pounds.

Proposed Trial by Torbay and South Devon NHS Foundation Trust

As a resident of Olchard and an Intensive Care Medicine Consultant at Torbay Hospital, I would like to make you aware of a proposed trial by Torbay and South Devon NHS foundation Trust, to move out of hours Primary Percutaneous Coronary Intervention (PPCI) services to the RD & E in Exeter. If the proposal goes ahead, residents in the Torbay area who are having a heart attack, would have to travel to Exeter for the procedure urgently needed - delaying their treatment by over an hour. This really could mean the difference between life and death.

Important Notice on Avian Influenza,

(This subject was brought up in the recent PC meeting.)

It seems many poultry owners in our community are not aware of the current requirements for looking after their birds. This applies to not only owners of chickens, ducks, pea fowl or others and whether it is one bird or five hundred!

Since 25th January 2025 the whole of England, including Devon, became part of an Avian Influenza Protection Zone (again). Some areas are covered with mandatory housing requirements (not Devon yet). But there are strict biosecurity requirements that must be followed by all in the zone, including protecting your birds from exposure to wild birds, so not running free, unless exemption has been issued, this can mean netting them and not strict housing indoors. Their feed and water must be covered, to avoid exposure to wild birds as well. Strict hygiene and disinfection, such as foot baths, must be in place. Every bird owner should be registered with DEFRA/APHA and be fully aware of these measures and their need to be compliant, otherwise risking a fine.

This is not just to protect the birds, it is also to protect humans due to high potential of transmission, if it is not controlled effectively.

There is plenty of extra information and detail online explaining everything.

So, we ask everyone with poultry or birds to act and be responsible for all of us and our health.

Update on Avian Influenza, since I received this article there has been an outbreak on February 19th, just outside Teignmouth, so we now sit in a 10KM surveillance zone, meaning enforcement of any restrictions is much tighter and records of any movement including people must be kept! - Editor
